C., Sept. 27, 1882; s. of Myer S. and Maria Isaacs; ed. attended Training Sch. of Normal Coll. later Sachs Collegiate Inst., grad. 1899; Columbia Coll., B.A. 1903; Columbia Law Sch., 1 yr., M.A., polit. sci.; grad. N. Y. Law Sch., 1905; m. Edith Somborn, 1910, N. Y.; ch.: Helen Herrick, Myron S. Practised law in office of M. S. & I. S. Isaacs, 15 yrs.; associated with Edgar A. Levy in real estate, bldg. and investments until 1938; pres., Borough of Manhattan, Jan. 1938-Dec. 1941, reduced budget by over 25 percent in 4 yrs., maj. achievement the planning and construction of Franklin D. Roosevelt Dr. (formerly East River Dr.); resumed law practice Jan. 1942; associated with M. S. & I. S. Isaacs; elected mem. of City Council, 1941; re-elected in 1943 and 1945, with a vote leading that of all other candidates; candidacy for re-election to City Council in 1945 was endorsed by Central Trades & Labor Council of Greater N. Y., A.F.L. and Greater N. Y. C.I.O. Council; re-elected in 1949 from 20th Senatorial Dist.; nominated by Rep. Party and Liberal Party; candidacy endorsed by City Fusion Party, Citizens Union and Americans for Dem. Action. Re-elected, 1953 and 1957. Mem. Rep. Co.
